Lent is Coming!



On the **25th** day of **February**, Ash Wednesday, we will gather to smudge every forehead with ashes, calling each of us to be faithful to the Gospel. During this holy season of Lent, we journey with all the Catechumens and Candidates to the sacraments of Initiation: the Easter bath of Baptism, the anointing with Holy Chrism, and the Table of the Lord. Through this journey, we renew our own life in Christ.

Lent means springtime. Daytime lengthens during Lent. The northern hemisphere turns toward the sun, the source of life, and winter turns into spring. In Hebrew, the word for *repentance* is the same as the word that means *to turn*, like the turning of the earth to the sun, like the turning of the soil before planting. In the lengthening brightness from Ash Wednesday until Holy Thursday afternoon, our holy Lent, we turn to God as our source of life.

We invite you to enter fully and intentionally into this time of renewal. We keep Lent together. We put aside our business-as-usual attitude and support each other in prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Growing in Faith

Legendary Lodge is a summer camp facility owned and operated by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Helena. We offer week-long summer camp programs that provide an outdoor experience for young people. This allows them to live, pray, and play in an atmosphere that develops their relationship with God and one another in the Catholic tradition. We accept boys and girls entering the 5th grade through 12th grade and welcome those of other denominations as space allows.

Camp Activities

The needs and desires of our campers are taken into consideration by our competent and well-trained team who supervise and participate in all activities. Camp activities include swimming, canoeing, dancing, and a variety of games like basketball, soccer, and ultimate frisbee. We have times for prayer, arts and crafts, hiking and other activities that build character and develop a camper's faith life. The celebration of Eucharist, an opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and other prayer moments are an important part of our week.

Camp Team Members

Our paid and volunteer team members exemplify the highest quality in Catholic principles. Counselors are chosen not only for their ability to relate to and work with young people, but also because of their faith commitment and involvement in the Catholic Church. Paid counselors serve for all 10 weeks of the summer and all are young adults active in the Catholic faith and exemplify the qualities of good role models and mentors. Volunteer counselors give of their time for a week during the summer and though it is not necessary for them to be Catholic, they agree to uphold the principles of the Catholic faith while working with campers. All team members seek to know the campers personally and allow the campers to get to know them, so that together they all might grow in faith.
