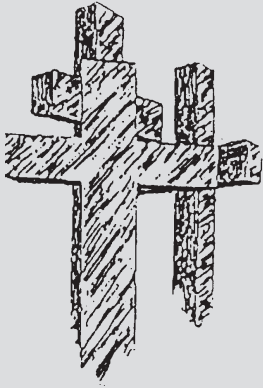

**STROKE RISK FACTORS:
WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW**

About 50 percent of people who survive a stroke will be disabled in a way that prevents them from being completely independent and taking care of everyday activities. The good news? Nearly 80 percent of all strokes can be prevented if you know your risk factors, and make changes that can decrease your risk.

Stroke Risk Factors :What You Can't Control

There are a number of risk factors for stroke that you can't do anything about, except to be aware of them and take other steps to improve your overall health.

- Your Age. If you're 55 or older, you're at an increased stroke risk, and that risk rises every year as you age.
- Your Gender. Women recently seem to be edging ahead of men in overall number of strokes; what's more, women are consistently more likely to die from hemorrhagic stroke.
- Your Family History. If you have a close relative, a parent, grandparent or sibling who has had a stroke, your stroke risk goes up.
- Your medical history. If you've already had a stroke, a transient ischemic attack or a heart attack you are at a greater risk of having a stroke.

Your Race. African-Americans are more likely than Caucasians to die from ischemic stroke, the most common type, and Hispanics are more likely to die from hemorrhagic stroke.

DISCIPLE

Becoming Disciples through Bible Study

- * Do you want to understand the meaning of the Scriptures in your life?
- * Do you want to meet and form community with others who want to become disciples?
- * Will you commit to weekly prayer and reading of the scriptures?

DISCIPLE is for those who are beginners as well as those who have previous Scripture Study.

DISCIPLE is a 17-week study of the Old Testament. Each week's study focuses on a theme for one or more books. Examples are Authority, Wonder, Covenant, Leadership, etc.

Each participant receives a study manual as a guide. A New American Bible with maps, footnotes, and book introductions is needed. The study manual is \$30.

This study begins in early September. Times and dates will depend on the participant's choice. Call Sr. Doris to register.
